

**NOTICE OF DAY OF HEARING ON SPECIAL ASSESSMENT ROLL**

**PERRY LAKE LAKE LEVEL**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN**, that on **MONDAY, 22<sup>ND</sup> DAY OF MARCH, 2010**, the Special Assessment Roll assessing the cost of improvements to permit the maintenance of the seasonal level of Perry Lake (the "Project"), as set by court order on December 27, 2006 by the Honorable Judge Ronald M. Bergeron, to parcels within the Perry Lake Lake Level Special Assessment District and a Computation of Costs for the Project will be subject to review for one day, from **9:00 A.M. - 5:00 P.M.** at the Office of the acting Oscoda County Drain Commissioner, 300 W. 8<sup>th</sup> Street, Mio, Michigan 48647.

The acting Oscoda County Drain Commissioner, acting on behalf of the County of Oscoda, serving as the statutory delegated authority of the County, has an established special assessment district as ordered on July 14, 2008 in Oscoda County Circuit Court, Mio, Michigan, by the Honorable Judge Ronald M. Bergeron, for parcels surrounding Perry Lake and has prepared a special assessment roll assessing a share of the cost of the Project to each parcel of land in the district to benefit from the Project.

The special assessment roll, Computation of Costs and plan copies, detailing the proposed Project, will be available for public inspection at the acting Oscoda County Drain Commissioner's Office, 300 W. 8<sup>th</sup> Street, Mio, Michigan 48647.

Part 307 of Act No. 451 of Public Acts of 1994, as amended, provides that the special assessment roll with the assessments listed shall be final and conclusive unless appealed in a court within fifteen (15) days after approval of the special assessment roll by resolution by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Oscoda. The Board of Commissioners is expected to consider a resolution approving the special assessment roll at a meeting to be held on March 23, 2010. Act No. 162 of Public Acts of 1962, as amended, provides that appearance and protest at the hearing on March 22, 2010 is required in order to appeal the amount of the special assessment to the State Tax Tribunal. An owner or party in interest, or his or her agent, may appear in person at the hearing to protest the special assessment or shall be permitted to file his or her appearance of protest by letter and in such case his or her personal appearance shall not be required.
